The pARTners Project The fruits of collaboration

In a triumphant celebration of OSA's education mandate, 11 courageous OSA members, in collaboration with 11 equally courageous emerging artists, have produced an edgy, contemporary body of work which confirms OSA's reputation as a leader in the Canadian art scene.

Four years in the making, the **pARTners project** faced countless challenges — the Woodstock Art Gallery controversy, the stroke suffered by Co-chair and Curator of the Woodstock Art Gallery, Maria Ricker, the simultaneous leaves of absence by both contacts at the University of Western Ontario and Fanshawe College, the securing of gallery venues, the securing of sponsors and an enormous fundraising effort. However, due to the perseverance of the **pARTners** Board of Directors, we are finally ready to reveal an exciting collection of collaborative works of art.

In the 120-page catalog, designed by **Ernestine TahedI**, you will take a marvellous journey with the artists, who were paired randomly, as they solved a myriad of problems in their efforts to work towards their collaborative goals. An additional challenge was the mandatory use of Japanese papers in the collaborative work, for most of the artists had never used this material previously.

The tour of **pARTners: a collaboration** begins at the brand new, state-of-the-art Woodstock Art Gallery, November 12, 2011 — January 14, 2012. Please support OSA as a whole, and the artists in particular, by joining us at the reception on Saturday, November 19, 2-4 p.m. This is a celebration of the vitality and reputation of OSA as a groundbreaking society. It is a celebration worthy of our collective presence, especially as a beginning to our 140th Anniversary celebrations.






The texture of water, 12x12, acrylic/canvas, 2011

Killarney OSA Field Trip 2012

A report from Lynn Bishop, Chair

We have our rooms booked, we just need your \$50 deposit to confirm your participation. Please feel free to invite significant others interested in this four-day, three-night stay. All deposits of \$50 should be made out to **Killarney Mountain Lodge**, but please **mail them to Lynn Bishop** for collection on behalf of KML: Lynn Bishop, 10695 Acton Rd., RR1 Sunderland, ON LOC 1HO. Here are the details received from Killarney Mountain Lodge: Arrival Thursday, Sept 20 and departure Sunday, Sept 23, 2012. Numbers to be determined (approximately 20 to 30). The rate, including three meals daily (packed lunches will be provided as required), will be as follows: \$135 per person per night based on double occupancy. \$175 per night for single occupancy. These rates are for accommodation in our Main Lodge and Pine Lodge and as of today I have reserved all the rooms in the Main Lodge (8) and all the rooms in the Pine Lodge (16) for your group. Total 24 rooms. If you require more space we will accommodate your members in our cabin accommodation but the price will be higher - \$165 per person per night based on double occupancy and \$215 per night for single occupancy.

If you cancel two weeks or more prior to your confirmed arrival date we refund the deposit less a \$25 bookkeeping charge. If notice of cancellation is less than two weeks prior we hold the entire deposit for another reservation by you either that same season or anytime the following year - or you forfeit the deposit.

The OSA trip is taking shape -- it's all very exciting and we would love to have you join us.
